Portland Rose Festival Open House

The Rose Building was originally built to be Portland's Visitors Information Center, designed by famed local architect John Yeon, whose work is known for its reflection of Northwest modernism. Open in 1949, the building has also been used as a museum, a meeting place and a restaurant. After standing empty for nearly three years, the newly-renovated Rose Building became the headquarters of the Rose Festival on March 19, 2010. The Open House on May 22 will feature a ribbon cutting and rose planting, as well as living history presentations and tours of the new rose garden, planted in 2009.

Veterans Memorial Coliseum

Portland's Memorial Coliseum opened in 1961 as a state-of-the-art events venue with one major feature: two large doors on either end to facilitate the line of march of the Rose Festival's Grand Floral Parade. 2010 marks 50 years of fantastic parades and thousands of other events enjoyed by Portlanders from their reserved seats inside the Coliseum. The Coliseum, now on the historic register, has hosted performers like the Beatles and the Rolling Stones, as well as being the home of the Portland Trail Blazers for more than 35 years.
